What this service supports

How we work

We work alongside leaders to understand context, capacity, and need. Our approach is collaborative, proportionate, and focused on improving everyday experience and outcomes for pupils with SEND.

1. Initial discussion to clarify priorities and context
2. Review of existing documentation, systems, and data
3. Engagement with leaders and key staff
4. Clear feedback with agreed next steps

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What this looks like in practice

- Agree priorities and parameters of the work
- Review of SEND systems, provision, and deployment of support
- Consideration of identification, planning, and impact
- Classroom-level practice and reasonable adjustments
- Written summary with strengths, areas for development, and next steps



Typical outcomes

Schools and trusts engaging with this service often report increased clarity around SEND priorities, improved staff confidence, more consistent provision across classrooms, and a stronger evidence base for inspection and self-evaluation.

Flexible delivery

Support can be provided as a one-off review, a focused improvement project, or as part of a longer-term partnership. Delivery is shaped around context, capacity, and need.
